President's Letter

We are nearly half way through the year and the number of pets seeking our help has already exceeded our expectations. More pets than ever are turning to Second Chance for help. We are so very proud of how far we have come and all that we can do for pets.

We have expanded our surgical abilities so more pets can receive the surgeries they need. Our larger Springfield hospital that opened last year is already helping nearly twice as many pets as the year before. And we have been out in the community providing lifesaving preventative care such as vaccine clinics at a higher rate than ever. It is heartwarming to know we have the ability to help more pets. This is due in large part to our wonderful family of donors who help us to be able to do what we do every day.

This year we are celebrating our 20th year of helping pets. That is not a long time in animal welfare years, but how far we have come exceeds our young life. We started out in 1999 with a dream to build an animal shelter to help house pets and get them into new homes. We did that. But we knew more was needed. We listened to the community and saw the needs of the pets. So, we expanded to offer vaccine clinics to prevent disease, low cost spay neuter to control the overpopulation, and then we did more. We opened up our first full-service veterinary hospital with a promise to provide access to care for all pets, not just those that could afford veterinary services but also those that needed subsidized rates to get their pets the care they needed. We did that. Then we opened a second hospital in Springfield in 2015 and another one in Worcester in 2017. We didn't stop there. We created programs and services to reach those in the most need. Homebound to the Rescue was created to provide free veterinary services to the elderly in elderly housing so they could care for their pets and bring services right to their door. There are so many programs, too many to list here, but we keep creating them. We have programs to take shelter dogs out for the day to get them more exposure and a day away from their kennel, behavioral training for cats, Project Good Dog that pairs behaviorally needy pets with correctional facility residents so that they can get one on one 24/7 time to be trained and get great homes.

We are proud of how far we have come. We are equally excited at what will come next. Thank you to everyone that has been on this journey with us and continues to do so. It is a journey and we will continue on this road until every pet has a safe loving home, access to medical care, and all they need to live a long and happy life. We hope you will continue with us on this journey so every pet can have a second chance.

Keeping Pets Healthy in Our Communities

Second Chance is committed to keeping all pets healthy in communities across Massachusetts. In addition to our three full-service veterinary hospitals, we have several programs serving pets in need beyond our walls:

Vaccine Clinics:

This spring, we had 9 vaccines clinics in towns throughout Central and Western Massachusetts offering rabies and distemper/parvo vaccines at \$5 each thanks to a generous grant from PetSmart Charities. These vaccines not only protect the pets that received them, but can help keep all pets in the community healthy by stopping the spread of rabies and parvo. We also offered microchips which help reunite lost pets with their owners.



Mobile Veterinary Clinic:


Our Mobile Veterinary Clinic ,which has been making regularly scheduled visits in Webster and Dudley, is preparing to expand the schedule to more locations. This program brings lifesaving vaccines and services to pets in underserved communities. Some of the pets we help at these clinics have never seen a veterinarian before.

Homebound to the Rescue:

The Homebound to the Rescue program began as an extension to our Pet Food Pantry program and has grown into an important resource for low-income pet owners. Our mobile veterinary clinic makes visits to elderly housing areas to provide no-cost care for pets that would otherwise have no access to vet care. Grant funding for this program is limited, and we rely on donations from generous people like you, to keep this important program running. Thank you.

Adoption Center Filled to Capacity in June

Last month Second Chance responded to an unprecedented number of requests for help from animal control officers and other shelters in addition to taking in local homeless pets. Our adoption center was filled to capacity and it



unit was even parked out front to make extra room for all the kitten in our care.



Because of our ability to handle pets with medical needs, Second Chance is an important partner for local animal control officers and other shelters. We are often the last chance for these pets, so we are grateful to our volunteers and staff who worked extra hours to make sure everyone was cared for. We are also grateful to our generous donors. who make all the lifesaving possible.

Second Chance Medical Director Voted Best Veterinarian

Her special interests include dentistry, population control, soft tissue and orthopedic surgery and geriatric medicine. Dr. Park is certified in veterinary acupuncture and also has a certificate in aquatic pathobiology.

Battling Heartworm Disease

Right now, there are 8 Second Chance dogs being treated for heartworm disease. These dogs require more rigorous treatment than the average pet surrendered to the shelter. One of the dogs, Elsie, developed serious complications and staff feared we might lose her. Thankfully she's on the mend, but her medical bills are expected to reach \$10,000.

Heartworm is deadly if not treated, but it is completely preventable by keeping dogs on preventative medication vear round.

Heartworm positive dogs in overcrowded shelters can face dire circumstances. Second Chance is grateful for the financial support our donors provide to care for these dogs in peril.
